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# How To Use Your Handihaler Device Containing Tiotropium (Spiriva®)

#### Why use this sheet?

This sheet contains important information to help you use the inhaler device properly. Keep it in a place where you can find it. This sheet also indicates how the inhaler will help you and reminds you of how many puffs to take and how often.

### **Inhaler Administration Steps**

#### Prepare the device

- 1. Open lid and mouthpiece.
- 2. Fold and separate the two blister strips, tear down the middle. Peel back foil on flat side, exposing only one capsule.
- 3. Place the capsule in the chamber.
- 4. Close mouthpiece, ensuring a click is heard.
- 5. Hold inhaler upright, then press blue button fully once (this pierces the capsule).

#### Get ready to inhale

- 6. Breathe out normally and away from the inhaler.
- 7. Put mouthpiece in mouth between your teeth and close lips around it to make a good seal.
- 8. Inhale forcefully and deeply until your lungs are full, so that the capsule vibrates as you breathe in.
- 9. Hold breath for 5 to 10 seconds, while removing the inhaler from your mouth.
- 10. Breathe out away from the inhaler.
- 11. Repeat steps 6-8 but do not pierce the capsule again (do not press blue button again).
- 12. Open the mouthpiece and tip the used capsule in the garbage and close. Wash your hands.
